
- 1) Which of the following statements is false? (1 point)

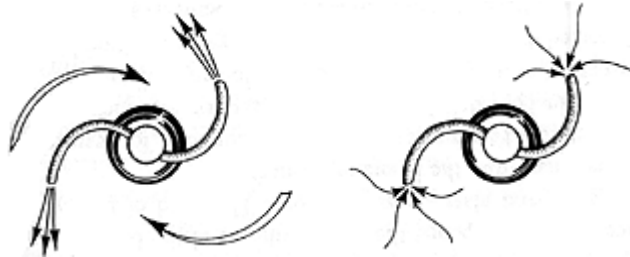
